For June the Mission Committee will focus on missions our Deacons and the Church are doing locally such as the Dual Language Class Ministry (Spanish / English) headed by Michelle Shaffer and Tawnee Hunter, New Castle's City Rescue Mission in their outreach to homeless men, Westminster College's Food Pantry to assist students in need. **We will start with PB&J – PB&J is Packing Backpacks and Joy:**



27% of the students in Wilmington Area School District qualify for free or reduced price breakfast and lunch through the National School Lunch Program. It is the fuel they need to get them through the week. What happens to these children when they go home over the weekend? Many do not have enough food. Research shows that students who do not get enough food over the weekend - even when they come back to school and get breakfast and lunch again – are not “up to speed” educationally until Wednesday. Two days out of five that they are not receiving the full benefit of their schooling.

PB&J is a cooperative venture of WASD, Community Food Warehouse and the New Wilmington Ministerium. Volunteers run the program. They pack bags weekly, work with the school district to sign up students, and find and manage funding. At this time there are 37 students in the program.

Each participating student receives a plastic grocery bag filled with child-friendly, shelf-stable/non-perishable nutritious food. Included in the bag is food for 2 breakfasts, 2 lunches, and 3 snacks.

Volunteers pack food weekly and deliver the bags of food to the schools. The NWPC Fruit Ladies add fresh fruit to the food bags. On Fridays, or the last school day of the week, food packs are placed in the students' own backpacks by school personnel.

There are over 100 people involved. Volunteers from the churches who are on packing teams (including 3 packing teams from NWPC) and teachers and secretaries at the schools make this program work.

Some comments from teachers about PB&J:

- *It's an excellent program! I wish more families would take advantage of it.*
- *Keep up the great work! So needed.*
- *It is great. Thank you!*
- *The students look forward to the food. They have asked me about it before I have it in their backpacks. (They don't want me to forget)*
- *This is a wonderful program. Hats off to the volunteers and businesses that have made this possible for our students.*
- *I am beyond grateful this program exists. I see the difference it makes.*
