Ethiopia is our mission focus for July and for great reason; NWPC supports both the work of PC(USA) Mission Co-Workers Michael and Rachel Weller and the 2019 Summer Service Team of NWMC which served in Ethiopia, working with the Wellers.

Here is a brief summary of the Summer Service Team trip from NWMC Director Rev. Ginny Teitt:

For 3 weeks the Summer Service Team explored the city of Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, each day seeing new sights, meeting new people, and learning about the Ethiopian church and culture. The team worked closely with the Mekane Yesus Church, teaching English and having impactful conversations. The focus of the team for this trip was building relationships with the Ethiopian people, learning from them, and sharing stories together. The team also had the opportunity to spend time at the Center for Mentally Challenged children for two weeks, learning from the teachers and connecting with the students. Lastly, the team was in the Gambella region of Ethiopia, where they spent two weeks with Rachel and Michael Weller, PCUSA Mission Co-Workers. While there they worked with youth in trauma healing sessions, connecting with and learning from people in the Gambella region and the Wellers. The team is so very thankful for your continued prayers and looks forward to sharing everything they've learned during this incredible experience!"
