Witnessing Ministries of Christ is a Presbyterian Sponsorship Program established for changing the lives of Dalit Christian children through nurture and education. Their philosophy is to help people so they can stand on their own feet. This is the reason they educate children to make them fully capable to learn and to earn their own living and not to need further help from their families.
