OCTOBER MISSION FOCUS: United States

The October mission focus highlights two of our local ministries, City Rescue Mission, New Castle, PA, and the Westminster College Student Food Pantry.

There is a continuing need for food for **Westminster College students**: canned fruits & vegetables, canned pasta meals or chili, canned or non-refrigerated packaged meat, tomato sauce and pasta, boxed meals as macaroni and cheese, boxed mashed potatoes, rice, canned soups & broths, crackers, cold & hot cereals, nut butters, jams & jellies, and snack bars. Other non-perishable, practical items are also welcome! A collection bin is located by the door near the library.

From October 24 – November 14 we will be collecting donations for the **Thanksgiving Baskets** for needy families in the New Castle area. Items that are needed: canned yams, canned gravy, stuffing mix, evaporated milk, cranberry sauce, pie crust mix, pie filling (fruit or pumpkin), canned vegetables. A turkey can be donated for \$15.00 (mark “birds” on the memo line). A grocery cart and baskets will be located at the church doors.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

This morning, **SALT** began a discussion of *Progressive Faith and Practice: Thou Shalt Not Stand Idly By*, by Roger L. Ray. Holocaust survivor and Nobel Prize winner Elie Wiesel has said that there is a new commandment: "Thou shalt not stand idly by." This book articulates a progressive faith that represents a true marriage of the academic work of the modern biblical critical movement and the historical Jesus work of the Jesus Seminar applied within the life of an active parish. Affirming an evidence-based approach to faith, Ray strives to apply Wiesel's injunction to actively respond to the injustice, violence, and discrimination in the world. Ray describes what progressives can embrace intellectually and morally, and how those convictions can be lived out in a faith community. From the Presbyterian Book of Order:

G-2.0201 Deacons defined:

The ministry of deacons as set forth in Scripture is one of compassion, witness, and service, sharing in the redeeming love of Jesus Christ for the poor, the hungry, the sick, the lost, the friendless, the oppressed, those burdened by unjust policies or structures or anyone in distress. Persons of spiritual character, honest repute, exemplary lives, brotherly and sisterly love, sincere compassion, and sound judgment should be chosen for this ministry.

Section G-2.0301 Ruling Elder defined:

As there were in Old Testament times elders for the government of the people, so the New Testament church provided persons with particular gifts to share in discernment of God’s Spirit and governance of God’s people. Accordingly, congregations should elect persons of wisdom and maturity of faith, having demonstrated skills in leadership and being compassionate in spirit. Ruling elders are so named ...because they are chosen by the congregation to discern and measure its fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life.

Overview of Trustees:

The ministry of trustees is to serve as stewards of the congregation’s facility and resources, ensuring that a church building intended for worship, education and fellowship works *for* the congregation and not against it. Trustees coordinate with staff members in overseeing all levels of maintenance. They also provide leadership to the congregation in the form of long-range facility, capital campaign, and resource management planning. While not ordained like Elders and Deacons, the role of the Trustee is vital to the congregation’s ministry and mission.
