



TWO URGENT REQUESTS JUST RECEIVED:

1. From Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA): "On December 10, a horrific line of powerful tornadoes ripped across several states, ending the lives of more than 100 people and wreaking devastation across many communities by the time morning had broken. One of these tornadoes was on the ground for a terrifying and unprecedented 250 miles, more than 200 of those miles in Kentucky alone. In the wake of these catastrophic storms, we are called to be the hands and feet of God as we reach out to shelter, feed, care for and help rebuild the lives of those who have lost loved ones, homes, work and a sense of safety as a result of the tornadoes. We are invited to stand with them — and to stand together — bearing witness by our gifts and prayers that God is indeed incarnate among us, no matter what. **The needs for the response will be great. God's people are once again called on to stand in the "GAP" — Give. Act. Pray.**"

2. From the Red Cross: "We are offering a \$250 Amazon.com Gift Card to help combat the lowest blood supply levels at the Red Cross in 10+ years. Our current supply has forced some hospitals to defer patients from major surgery like organ transplants. Some patients requiring transfusions **may not receive the blood products they need.** We are facing a dangerous situation unless more donors give over the holidays."
