CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE CORNER:

- On Friday, January 12th, the Maple Street door was removed and a temporary entrance was created.
- On January 26th or 29th the asbestos abatement company will start putting up the barriers to prepare for the asbestos removal. That process should take at least a week. Once the asbestos removal is completed, the general contractor will start demo work in the social hall. Total construction will take 3 to 4 months.

Please be patient as meeting and Sunday school locations will need to be relocated.
