March Mission Focus: eduKENYA

Children unsupervised, out of school, playing and wading through trash and debris, missing multiple meals a day - this was the unsettling reality Adam Gould witnessed in 2006 while spending time with communities living in extreme poverty in Nairobi, Kenya. Motivated by these images and a passion to see change, Adam established eduKenya, a fully registered 501(c)3 non-profit organization.

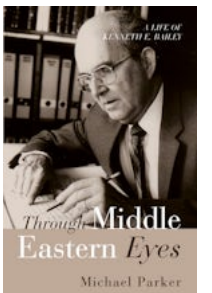


The Mawewa Preschool and the Primary School are both located in, and serve, the children of the Mathare slum. eduKenya strives to provide a high quality and holistic educational experience to all its children that addresses their physical, mental, social and spiritual needs. Chelezo High School is a high-quality boarding school primarily serving children from the Mawewa Primary School as well as children from outside Mathare who live in extreme poverty. The boarding school is currently located about 3 hours from Nairobi.

Each school day eduKenya's schools provide delicious and nutritious meals for students. For a number of children, the food they receive through the school's feeding program is all they may eat for the day. The meals enable students to concentrate on learning and reach their potential.

eduKenya also focuses on relationships within the community by getting to know the parents and families of the children in school, seeking to not only understand where they are coming from, but also their passions and desires. eduKenya provides basic reading, math and business management skills to each community member they engage. The goal is that all trainings provide opportunities for gaining skills, knowledge, and confidence with the intended impact of more financially stable homes in Mathare.

Deacons met on Wednesday, March 6. How deacons connecting with fellow congregation members through visits and phone calls may provide fellowship and support was reviewed. While there are few homebound members, there are other times when someone may benefit from a caring contact from a deacon.

A review of February activities –

- 62 pieces of correspondence were sent including birthday cards, get-well greetings, and notes to congregation members.
- 13 connections were made with congregation members through visits and phone calls.
- 8 meals were provided.
- Deacons assisted with home communion and served communion at SOG while worshiping with residents while viewing the broadcast service.

March Trustee Meeting Summary

The Trustees met Wednesday, March 6. The following motions were approved:

One Great Hour of Sharing Offering – Palm Sunday

NWPC's One Great Hour of Sharing will be given to South Sudan's Humanitarian Relief. Denise Sciuto of Frontier Fellowship and Sharon Kandel, our mission partner from the PCUSA, have been involved in various ways in South Sudan. Rev. Jim Leuenberger will be traveling to that country in April to teach at three colleges and training schools.

Since gaining independence from Sudan on July 9, 2011, South Sudan has confronted a number of humanitarian challenges. These include disease outbreaks, environmental shocks, high rates of food insecurity, poor macroeconomic conditions, and widespread violence, all of which have driven repeated displacement of at-risk populations. As a result, populations are less able to cope with shocks and increasingly rely on the humanitarian community to meet their basic needs. An estimated 9.4 million people—76 percent of the country's population—were in need of humanitarian assistance during 2023, according to the 2023 UN Humanitarian Needs Overview for South Sudan. However, bureaucratic impediments on relief organizations, insecurity, and logistical challenges constrain the delivery of critical humanitarian assistance to populations in need across the country.
