


### November 2024 - Trustees Meeting Summary



### **Best Strawberry Pretzel Salad (Dessert!)**

Prep Time 30 mins Cook Time 10 mins Total Time 40 mins

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- One, 6-ounce box strawberry gelatin mix
- 2 cups boiling water
- 2 cups crushed pretzel pieces
- ½ cup finely chopped pecans (*optional-for nutty richness*)
- ½ cup melted butter
- ¾ cup granulated sugar + 1 tbsp, divided
- 8 ounces cream cheese softened
- 8 ounces whipped topping like Cool Whip
- 1½ pounds fresh strawberries, hulled and sliced thin

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1-Preheat oven to 350°F. Grease a 9 x 13-inch baking dish. Mix the strawberry jello with 2 cups boiling water, stirring until dissolved. Allow to cool to room temp.
- 2-2 cups of crushed pretzels: You can chop them, place them in a zip bag and beat with a rolling pin, or quickly pulse them in a food processor. Then chop the pecans.
- 3-Put the crushed pretzels, chopped pecans, ¼ cup + 1 tbsp sugar in baking dish. Pour melted butter over the top; toss well to coat. Press pretzel mixture into a tight even layer; bake for 10 minutes.
- 4-In a clean mixing bowl, use a mixer to beat the cream cheese with the remaining ½ cup sugar, until light and fluffy. Gently fold in whipped topping until smooth and even. Set aside.
- 5-Trim the tops off the strawberries, then thinly slice. Keep out one-third of the strawberry slices and finely dice (to fill in the cracks.) Then mix all the berries together.
- 6-Spread the cream cheese filling evenly over the cooled pretzel layer. Spoon the prepared strawberries evenly over the cream layer.
- 7-Pour cooled strawberry jello over the strawberries, so all are completely coated but not floating in it. Refrigerate until jello is set, usually 2-3 hours. Cut and serve cold.
