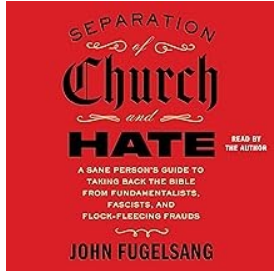

October Mission Flag Focus: India



Two years ago the New Wilmington Presbyterian Church was blessed by visits from Chris and Ruth Vaz who have been working for 30 years with a tribal group in the hills of central India. This community had no Christian church. So Ruth and Chris, who are natives of India, obtained doctoral degrees from Fuller Seminary in anthropology and linguistics, to prepare for their life work. They began by getting to know this tribe, learning their local language, and doing the long research necessary so that this language could be in written form. Then they began translating the New Testament.

This has been a lifelong commitment of this couple and amazing things have happened, but not without the trials and tribulations that are always required in such work. Chris continues as a highly respected scholar in Bible translation. Ruth has been recognized for her amazing foundational work on culture that takes her into interaction with physicists and mathematicians on the deepest levels. This helps scholars understand the significance of culture and the importance of all cultures. Ruth's background in Hinduism and Chris' Roman Catholic upbringing widen even further their amazing devotion to Jesus as Lord and Savior.
