ANNOUNCEMENTS



On this first Sunday in Advent, many of our hearts are filled with eager anticipation as we look towards Christmas. For some in our church family who have experienced the loss of a loved one, however, this can be a very difficult time. As we seek to minister to one another, let us be sensitive to the particular kind of pain that may be experienced during the holidays. It is normal to have a multitude of emotions as one remembers past Christmases. Expressing these emotions to someone can validate the life of a loved one, and move the grieving person along in the normal process of grief. Healing comes from this kind of opening. Be aware that a grieving person may become more tired than usual, as energy is used to cope with emotions. Or thinking may not be as clear as usual, or decisions hard to make. The person experiencing this, and those around him/her need to be tolerant of these changes. Nurturing oneself, trusting that God is very near, getting enough rest, eating balanced healthy meals, and lowering expectations usually helps one move through a time when a “surge of grief” may occur. Openly allowing this process, and sharing the feelings can bring one in touch with God’s comfort and peace. Christmas can still be a time of joy, but it will never be the same as it was before the death. Recognizing this and embracing this reality can be a real Christmas gift!
